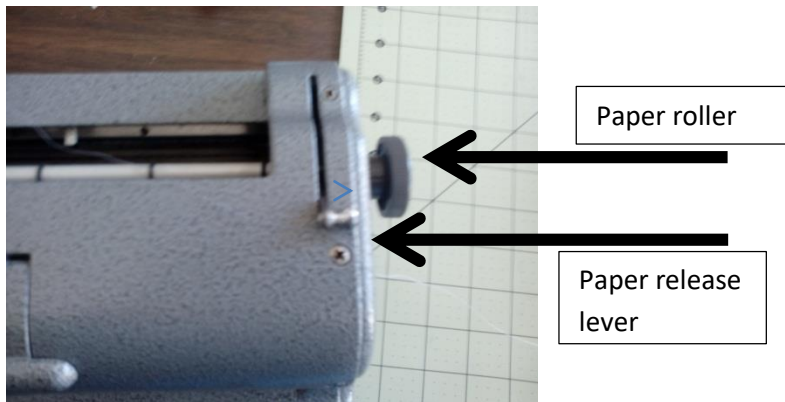


How to Load Braille Paper

I taught Jeffery a little chant to help him remember how to load paper into his braille writer. It will be so helpful if we all use the same terms when working with him to help him learn quickly.

To Load:

Step One: Levers Back, Wheel Forward



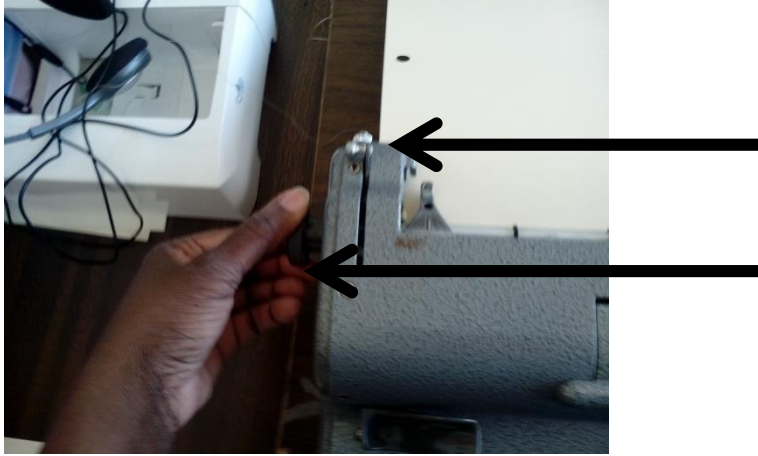
The paper release levers need to be in the open position pulled back (toward you.) The paper rollers need to be completely rolled forward (away from you.)

Step Two: Slide in, Slide in



The paper will slide in between the opening under the embosser. Slide it back until it "bumps" into the clip inside the braille writer.

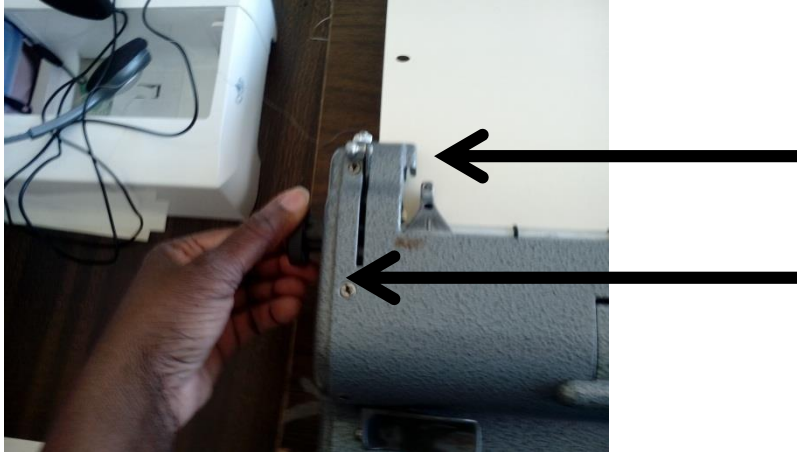
Step Three: Now clip and twist, twist, twist, twist. **DONE!!!!**



Push the paper release lever forward to lock the paper in place. Then turn the paper roller counter-clockwise until the paper has been completely loaded into the braille writer. (WARNING If as you turn, the paper comes out the front of the braille writer, unroll and begin again.)

To Remove:

Unclip and twist!



After you have finished brailleing, then release the paper release lever (bring the level toward you again.) Turn the paper roller clockwise to remove the paper.

Levers Back, Levers Back
Wheels forward, wheels forward.
Sliiiiiiiiiide in. Sliiiiiiiiiide in.
Now clip and twist. Clip and twist.
Twist, twist, twist **DONE!**

This is more of a call and response type chant. You begin and the student will echo.
